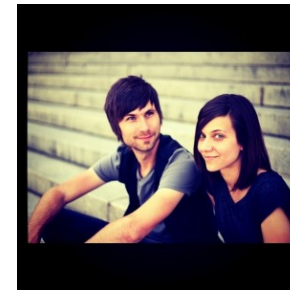

DISCIPLE-NOW (D-NOW) FAQs

WHAT IS D-NOW?

D-Now is a weekend Bible Study Retreat open to all students in grades 6-12 Feb. 3-5, 2012. Students will be organized into small groups of their peers of the same gender and comparable ages/grade and stay overnight in host homes of church members. The small groups will come together for worship at various times during the weekend. The Bible studies are led by trained college students with the goal of beginning or strengthening the ongoing process of discipleship in each student's life. D-Now will kick off with an association-wide rally at Hilldale Baptist Church Family Life Center Feb. 1. The following Baptist churches are participating in this year's D-Now: First Baptist St. Bethlehem, Hilldale, First Baptist Clarksville, Spring Creek, Hillcrest, Gum Springs, The Way, Northside, Northeast, Excell, and First Baptist Woodlawn.

WHAT WILL STUDENTS DO?

Experience a spirit of community and love in every host home.

Be challenged to make Jesus Lord of their lives.

Be challenged to share Christ with their family and friends.

Be challenged to make a decision for Christ.

Participate in one of the following missions/ministry projects in the Clarksville area on Saturday, February 4:

- Pack food boxes at Manna Café
- Door to door neighborhood canvassing to invite people to church and VBS
- Work with the Crossland Ave. Baptist Church Homeless Ministry (packing food; feeding hungry; clothes closet)
- Serve a meal at the Lighthouse Men's Shelter (only male students will participate in this activity)
- Preparing and delivering care packages to Montgomery Co. Jail (no contact with inmates)
- Prayer-walking schools and neighborhoods
- Cleaning Salvation Army Shelter and hanging and sorting clothes at shelter
- Raking leaves and odd jobs (such as window-washing) at residences of church members
- Cleaning, building repairs, yard-work, window-washing, etc. at Hope Pregnancy Center
- Cleaning and organizing at Safehouse Women's Shelter
- Visiting Nursing Homes
- Preparing and delivering food boxes for benevolence families
- Baking, cooking meals, light cleaning, etc. for church member families and homebound
- Random acts of kindness (such as, but not limited to, picking up trash, etc.)
- Handing out tracts and/or church flyers at a local business (Chick-fil-a, Hobby Lobby, etc.)

FBCSB's Child Safety Policy and Transportation Policy will be in effect during D-Now weekend. However, due to the nature and scope of D-Now, the following exceptions are made for this event only:

1. The guest speakers, the worship musicians and vocalists, and college students leading Bible studies will not necessarily be members of FBCSB. All adults serving in D-Now will be required to complete a Confidential Volunteer Application and are required to be Christians. We will conduct a criminal background check on all adult leaders serving in FBCSB's D-Now.
2. Member host homes could possibly have family members residing in the homes that are not church members. However, every adult in the host homes will be required to complete a Confidential Volunteer Application and the church will conduct a criminal background check on all adults who serve in FBCSB's D-Now.
3. Host home leaders will be permitted to help transport D-Now participants to church and ministry project sites. All drivers will complete a Driver Application Form, and the church will conduct a Motor Vehicle Record check to ensure drivers are eligible to drive on behalf of the church in accordance with our Transportation Policy.
4. While participating in the Saturday ministry projects and the association-wide rally, students will likely come into contact with non-members who will not have been screened by FBCSB (Confidential Volunteer Application, background check, etc.). All D-Now events under the direction of FBCSB will be conducted with the appropriate number of adult chaperones who have completed the Confidential Volunteer Application and for whom a criminal background check has been conducted.

Waiver of Liability and Hold Harmless Agreement – D-Now Minor Participants

1. In consideration for receiving permission for my minor child to participate in FBCSB’s **DiscipleNow (D-Now) event February 1 and February 3-5** (hereinafter referred to as activity), I hereby release, waive, discharge and covenant not to sue First Baptist Church St. Bethlehem, Inc., its officers, agents, servants, volunteers, and/or employees (hereinafter referred to as releasees) from any and all liability, claims, demands, actions, and causes of action whatsoever arising out of or related to any loss, damage, or injury, including death, that may be sustained by my minor child, or any property belonging to my minor child, whether caused by the negligence of the releasees, or otherwise, while participating in such activity, or while in, on, or upon the premises where the activity is being conducted.
2. **I am fully aware of the risks involved and hazards connected with said activity** including, but not limited to, sickness, bodily injury, death, emotional injury, personal injury, property damage and financial loss, and I hereby elect to voluntarily allow my minor child to participate in said activity with full knowledge that said activity may be hazardous to my child and my child’s property. I voluntarily assume full responsibility for any risks of loss, property damage, or personal injury, including death, that may be sustained by my child, or any loss or damage to property owned by me or my child, as a result of being engaged in said activity, whether caused by the releasees or otherwise.
3. **I acknowledge that I am aware of, and have investigated the risks to the extent necessary, all dangers and risks inherent in the activity** listed above, including the risk of serious bodily injury or death. I believe and represent that my child is physically able to safely participate in said activity. Activity could include, but not limited to:
 - ★ Bible studies led by college students who are members of another Baptist church
 - ★ Ministry projects as detailed in the attached description
 - ★ Participating in worship led by a worship leader and/or band from another Baptist church
 - ★ Lodging in church member host homes (with the possibility of non-church member family residing with them)
 - ★ Traveling to and from D-Now events in chaperone’s personal vehicles, church van, and church bus
4. **I further hereby agree to indemnify and hold harmless** the releasees from any loss, liability, damage, or costs, including court costs and attorney fees, that they may incur due to my child’s participation in said activity, whether caused by negligence of the releasees or otherwise.
5. **I understand that First Baptist Church St. Bethlehem does not maintain any insurance policy** specific to said activity or covering any circumstances arising from my participation in this activity or any activity associated with or facilitating that participation. As such, I am aware that I should review my insurance portfolio.
6. **I have received and understand** the attached FAQ Sheet featuring a description of the activity. I understand that if I have any questions regarding said activity, I am to contact Mark Ellison at 931-648-0395 for clarification.
7. **It is my express intent that this Waiver of Liability and Hold Harmless Agreement shall bind** the members of my family and spouse/partner, if I am alive, and my heirs, assigns, and personal representative, if I am deceased, and shall be deemed as a release, waive, discharge, and covenant not to sue the above named releasees. I hereby further agree that this Waiver of Liability and Hold Harmless Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Tennessee.
8. **In signing this release, I acknowledge and represent that I have read this Waiver of Liability and Hold Harmless Agreement**, understand it, and sign it voluntarily as my own free act and deed; no oral representations, statements, or inducements, apart from the foregoing written agreement, have been made; I am at least eighteen (18) years of age and fully competent; and I execute this release for full, adequate, and complete consideration fully intending to be bound by same. I further acknowledge that I am the parent or legal guardian of participant minor child and have full authority to make decisions on behalf of said child.

Medical Consent & Release
